Meals include full board (breakfast, lunch and dinner) for hunters and non-hunting companions. You will enjoy the delicious typical Argentine dishes, especially barbecued meats, as well as the finest wines from Mendoza and Patagonia. Both lunch and dinner include assorted beverages (bottled water, beer, soft drinks and wine) free of charge. They also offer a get-together by the bonfire before dinner, where everyone enjoys delicious regional products while sharing unforgettable anecdotes.



Each detail has been carefully planned so that your stay would be as pleasant as possible, large rooms with private bathrooms await you for a very well- deserved rest. They offer rifles (\$70/per day) and ammunition for hunters that do not wish to travel with their own weapons. Regulations require that a minimum of 7mm be used for Red Stags, which is why they recommend calibers such as 270, 30-06, 308, or 300 Winchester Magnum. The use of soft-point sport munitions is recommended.

The 14 feet high hunting stations that look over the fields, offering the hunter a privileged view and an unbeatable place to hunt. These modern towers are equipped with an elevator to make access easier, especially for those people with reduced mobility. The stations have heating, a bed, seats, a stove and are carpeted. They have created a comfortable space with the purpose of making long waits more comfortable.

Red Stag

(Cervus elaphus)

The biggest of all deer in South America, the stag can weigh up to 550 lbs. These are astute, wild and evasive animals, with well-developed senses of sight, smell and hearing, which allows them to be cautious. It is especially interesting to hunt them during the "bellowing" period –March and April– when they can be identified by their bellow.

Chital or Axis Deer

(Axis axis)

This deer, of Indian origin, was introduced in Argentina in the 1940's. Its coat is reddish fawn, marked with white spots, and it's under parts are white. Stags have antlers that usually show six points and may extend to 1 meter.



Blackbuck

(Antilope cervicapra)

This species, of Indian origin, was introduced in our country in the 1940's, for ornamental purposes. The fur is black and white and their trophy is the two straight corkscrew-shaped horns disposed as a V that reach up to 23 ½". It is one of the fastest of all terrestrial animals reaching to speeds of up to 50 MPH.





Fallow Deer

(Dama dama)

Adult bucks are 55"-63" long and 33"-37" shoulder height, and 132-200 lbs. in weight. The wild kind has a brown reddish coat with white spots in the back and a distinctive black and white rump. Their bellowing starts when the red deer's finishes and ends by the beginning of May.

European Mouflon

(Ovis orientalis musimon)

Mouflon have a red-brown short-haired coat with a dark back-stripe, light colored saddle patch. The males are horned. The horn is curved in almost one full revolution (up to 33"). Mouflon have a shoulder height of about 35" and a body weight of 110 lbs. (males) and 77 lbs. (females).



Scottish Blackface Sheep

Blackfaces are horned in both sexes, and as their name suggests, they usually have a black face (but sometimes with white markings) and black legs.

Feral Goat

(Capra aegagrus hircus)

It is a small-sized animal with curved horns, very agile and able to leap.



Cougar

(Felis concolor)

This big-sized feline is very elusive, which makes it difficult to chase. It is a night hunter of deer, sheep, pigs and calves. These Cougars are importable into the U.S.A.

TAKING FIREARMS TO ARGENTINA FOR HUNTING OR SHOOTING as of 1/1/15

Visitors who may wish to import firearms for hunting or target general are advised to apply for a temporary import permit at the Consulate. The following materials/information is required:

1. Valid passport (original)
2. 2 recent passport style photographs.
3. Valid US firearms/hunting license or permit (original)
4. Type of firearms (including model, make, serial number and gauge)
5. Type and quantity of ammunition.
6. Owner's current address in the United States, and temporary address in Argentina, including telephone numbers.
7. Hunting location (ranch, nearest city/town and province) in Argentina.
8. Airplane ticket with arrival and departure dates.
9. Processing fee: US\$ 40, payable by **money order only (recommended U.S. Postal Service Money Order)**. Make it payable to the "Consulate General of Argentina". **They do not accept cash or checks.** Processed within 7 (seven) working days. Please be aware that **it is no longer possible to submit applications by mail. Without exception**, all temporary import permit applicants are requested to present themselves at the Consulate to sign the form and have their fingerprints taken **with appointment only**. To request an appointment please send an email to: legal@consuladofargentino.net The Consulate's Legal Department is open Monday through Friday from 9 am to 12 pm.
